Create a Fund

Establishing a fund at Wayne County Community Foundation is an easy and effective way to invest in your community. Listed below are the types of funds available to our donors:

- **Community Funds** – most flexible fund to meet the changing needs of our community.
- **Field of Interest Funds** – support your particular areas of interest.

- **Donor or Corporate Advised Funds** – allow donors to recommend grants to the causes they care about in Wayne County or across the country.
- **Scholarship Funds** – support our local students with grants to pursue post-secondary education.
- **Designated Funds** – provide annual grants in perpetuity for one or more organizations of your choice.
- **Agency Funds** – created by charitable organizations to benefit the mission of the organization now and in the future.

We make it easy to establish a charitable fund that meets your personal needs. You sign a simple fund agreement and make your gift to open the fund. Most funds may be opened with a minimum gift of \$10,000; to open a new scholarship, the minimum is \$20,000. Your fund may be created with a current gift, or through a bequest. Our professional staff is ready to meet with you to talk about your goals, and create a plan that matches your charitable interests and financial situation. Whatever your philanthropic goals, we have the flexibility and tools to help you reach them.

*Each of our fund types may begin as an **Acorn Fund**. With their significantly lower minimums, these funds allow for younger families or seniors on fixed incomes to establish legacies on an installment basis. 

- You, or others, can add to the Fund you have established at any time, receiving tax benefits with each new gift.




THE POWER OF ENDOWMENT

Supporting your community for generations to come.

At the heart of the mission of the Foundation is building endowment to secure the future of Wayne County. We understand the power of permanence. We believe that it's the key to ensuring that our community's future will be even brighter than its past. When you create a charitable fund through the Foundation, you can benefit the community forever with a permanent endowment.

The graphic below shows that your endowment gift will grow over time, while still providing grants to the causes you care about.

LEGACY GIVING

You can support the charitable causes that are most meaningful to you even after your lifetime. A legacy gift can be an inspiration to your loved ones and your community. It will also maintain and strengthen WCCF for whatever the future may hold.

Wayne County Community Foundation can help you create a legacy gift that will support the well-being of the community you care about for many years to come.

What are the different ways to create your legacy?

A legacy gift with the Wayne County Community Foundation (WCCF) enables you to dedicate financial resources to your favorite charities or causes, and to do so in a way that fits your lifestyle, goals, and your family's financial situation. You can even create a permanent gift to charity that will also provide an income stream to you or your loved ones, often with tax benefits for you and your family. These life income gifts benefit you today, and ultimately WCCF.

Retirement Plans

Naming WCCF as a beneficiary of your IRA, 401k or 403b is a simple way to support the community while avoiding significant (often unanticipated) taxes.

Outright Bequests

You can make a bequest by including specific language in your will or living trust naming WCCF as the recipient of a testamentary gift. Your bequest can create a Fund in your name to benefit causes you select. (See "focus" question on right of page for details.)

Charitable Gift Annuity

You can make a gift to benefit the community while receiving fixed payments for the life of one or two beneficiaries (of similar age), regardless of the economic climate.

Charitable Trust

Giving through a trust provides financial benefits to you or a loved one, as well as the community.

Life Insurance

Including WCCF as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy, or assigning policy ownership to WCCF, can leverage small premium payments into significant community benefit.

Can I focus my philanthropy?

Absolutely yes! Because philanthropy is intensely personal, it's important to match your desire to give with a community need that "speaks to you."

Your planned gift with WCCF can create a Field of Interest Fund that will allow WCCF to give grants in the area you most care about. Or you can design a Designated Fund that will benefit one or more of your favorite nonprofits. If you want to make a difference in the lives of students, you can establish a Scholarship Fund. You can also donate unrestricted gifts, known as Community Funds, which allow WCCF to respond with the most flexibility to emerging needs in our community.

William Patterson 1931-2021



William "Bill" Patterson first came to Wooster in 1965, when he was named Executive Director of the Wooster

YMCA. After six years of serving the members and community youth, he continued his career with the YMCA in other cities – but Wayne County had made an impression on Bill and his family. Upon his retirement in 1980, he moved back to Wooster to continue serving the community.

Bill was elected as a City Councilman in 1981, going on to be named Council President. He served an unfinished term as Mayor of Wooster in 1995 and 1996. He chaired the Wooster Community Hospital Board of Governors and was instrumental in the great advancements that our community hospital made during his tenure.

A 60-year member of Rotary International, Bill was honored to receive the Rotary Paul Harris Fellowship Award.

In 2005, he established the ***William "Bill" Patterson Scholarship Fund*** at WCCF. This scholarship supports Wooster High School graduating seniors who will be attending Bill's alma mater, Ohio Northern University.

Bill's legacy lives on through his scholarship – and he will continue to touch the lives of future generations.

Empowering Women in Wayne County

Through effective grant making, The Women's Fund has the potential to transform the lives of women for the better – improving their situations and making a lasting impact on their families and communities. This year, the Advisory Committee awarded a total of \$17,450 in grants to nonprofit organizations serving women in Wayne County.



Staff of Wooster Community Hospital receives bereavement baskets from *Forget-Me-Not Baskets, Inc.* to give to families who have lost a child during pregnancy or childbirth.

Aultman Orrville Hospital received a \$6,450 grant to replace three pain medication pumps utilized by mothers during the labor process at their Family Birth Center.

Forget-Me-Not Baskets, Inc. received a \$1,000 grant to provide bereavement baskets for Wayne County residents who have lost a child during pregnancy or childbirth.

OneEighty, Inc. received a \$10,000 grant to help single women who are victims of domestic violence move into safe and stable housing when leaving the OneEighty shelter.

MOTHER'S DAY INITIATIVE

The **Mother's Day Initiative** is an opportunity for everyone to honor the women who have made a lasting difference in their lives, while also making a difference in the lives of women and girls throughout Wayne County. A total of 304 women were honored or remembered at Mother's Day, with \$15,365 added to The Women's Fund permanent endowment. Gifts to The Women's Fund will generate dollars to award grants to non-profit organizations serving Wayne County women...for generations to come.

While donors may contribute to The Women's Fund at any time and for any reason, the sole annual fundraiser of The Women's Fund is its Mother's Day initiative. A beautifully designed Mother's Day card is sent to the honoree the week of Mother's Day. If the gift is made to honor the memory of a special woman, a card is sent to the family.

Philanthropy on a Dollar-a-Day

GIVE 365 unites emerging philanthropists to make a collective impact on Wayne County, Ohio. With only a \$1 a day – or \$365 a year – pooled with gifts from other donors, members can join together to make a greater impact with their philanthropic dollars, while learning about the nonprofits who are making our communities better places to live and work. It also gives nonprofit organizations a way to demonstrate, to a captive audience, their impact and their potential.

This year's grant making focus for the Wayne County Community Foundation's GIVE 365 program was "Supporting Wayne County's Vulnerable Youth", with special consideration given to programs or projects that addressed childhood hunger. After reviewing grant applications, the group voted to award a total of \$19,000.



Backpack food programs, like those supported by GIVE 365, aim to close the gap in meals for children between Friday lunch and Monday breakfast by providing food for children over breaks during the school year, such as weekends and longer holidays.

Orrville United Way, Inc. received \$3,250 for their "Percy's Backpack Program" which provides weekend meals for students in the Orrville City and Dalton Local School Districts in conjunction with Orrville Salvation Army – Maiwurm Service Center.

People to People Ministries received \$7,250 to provide food and clothing resources to youth throughout Wayne County in their partnership with OHuddle.

Wooster Hope Center received \$8,500 for their "Backpack of Food Program" which provides meals to students at 13 elementary schools throughout Wayne County.

Wayne County Community Youth Foundation (WCCYF) provides a unique opportunity for high school students throughout Wayne County. This year, under the advisement of Deanna Troutman, 26 students representing 10 area high schools gained valuable leadership experience, while learning more about local charitable giving and how investments grow charitable funds.

The program highlights the essentials of community-based philanthropy including fundraising, and grant-making activities that provide funding for projects benefiting Wayne County youth. In addition to financial support, members of the Youth Foundation also work on teambuilding and leadership activities with other members and participate in community service projects, selected by them, to improve the quality of life in Wayne County.

This year, after reviewing grant applications, members voted to distribute \$5,000 in grants to three youth-oriented projects and programs:

RIDGE Project Inc., \$1,000 grant for the purchase of service project supplies needed for a food pantry and an area church in Wayne County.

Wayne County Children's Advocacy Center, \$1,500 towards renovations needed to the forensic room where child victims of sex abuse are interviewed.

Wayne County Children's STEAM Playlab, \$2,500 to purchase educational sensory-friendly STEAM sets for special learners.

In addition, members participated in "The Souper Bowl of Caring", a nationwide initiative which empowers youth and unites communities to tackle hunger using the energy of the Super Bowl. During the event, members collected \$600, which they donated to **Viola Startzman Clinic** to purchase food for Blessing Boxes, a part of the Clinic's Food Pharmacy Program.

Through effective grant making, the **Wayne County Emergency Response Fund** awarded grants to:



Stanley C. Gault Philanthropic Leadership Fund Awards First Grants

*Stan Gault and his wife Flo were the moving forces behind countless projects, programs, and scholarships that benefited organizations and individuals in Wayne County and beyond. Their generosity and ability to engage and inspire others were unprecedented. While Stan's passing in 2016 marked the end of an era, his legacy lives on through the **Stanley C. Gault Philanthropic Leadership Fund**.*


Established with a gift of \$500,000 from the Burton D. Morgan Foundation, the Fund quickly grew to over \$2 million thanks to the generosity of friends and associates who wanted to honor Stan's legacy and commitment to Wayne County, Ohio.

The goal of the permanently endowed fund is to perpetuate the ideal of service and active involvement in philanthropy that Stan embodied throughout his life. This year, the Fund was put to work in the community, making grants to nonprofit entities whose work supports the well-being of citizens in Wayne County through projects that enhance the quality of life and economic vitality of this region.

Ohio's Hospice LifeCare was awarded \$50,000 towards their Hospice Center for Supportive Care Campaign for renovations and expansion of services. The organization holds a special place in the heart of the Gault Family. The current 12-bed inpatient facility bears the name Stanley C. and Flo K. Gault Inpatient Pavilion. *(More on Ohio's Hospice LifeCare's current capital campaign can be found on page 14 of this annual report.)*

The Downtown Arts Theater, a non-profit committed to bringing movies, arts, and entertainment to downtown Wooster, will be awarded a total of \$100,000. In true "Gault-fashion", the funding helped get the project started with a \$20,000 grant to aid in purchasing the theater building, followed by an additional \$80,000 challenge grant that will be made once Phase 2 is within 10% of its stated campaign goal to ensure the project's success. The Downtown Arts Theater will collaborate with local partners to contribute to the economic development of an Arts District in the south end of downtown Wooster and to the cultural development of Wayne County by developing a state-of-the-art venue for film and live events.

Robert “Pete” Bogner Rotary Scholarship



Robert “Pete” Bogner, the icon of the Bogner Family, lived a life of service – service to his country, to his family, and to his community.

After receiving his pilot’s license from the Kings College School of Aviation in 1941, Pete enlisted in the United States Air Force where he trained as a B-24 bomber pilot. He was called to Active Duty in 1943, completing 28 successful missions during World War II, including Austria, Southern Germany, and Romania. As with most true heroes, Pete was always reluctant to talk about his military service; as a First Lieutenant in the 15th Army Air Corps, he earned several medals and citations.

Pete was not the only family member serving in World War II. In the fall of 1944, while Pete and his brother Richard were both stationed in Italy, they met and made a pact: if they both lived through WWII, they would come home and join their father in the family construction business. Happily, they both survived, and in late 1945, Theodore Bogner and Sons, Inc., (known today as Bogner Construction Company) was founded.

A true community leader, Pete’s dedication to service did not end with serving his country. He was a 72-year member of the Rotary Club of Wooster, where he served as President in 1971-1972. Additionally, he was a member of the Elks Club of Wooster, The American Legion, and actively involved in Zion Lutheran Church. Pete was a Wayne County Fund Drive Co-Chair for several years for The College of Wooster – as well as a fixture at many home athletic events, cheering on the Fighting Scots. After the passing of his wife and best friend, Jean “Bunny” Bogner, Pete established and was a generous contributor to the Jean “Bunny” Bogner Endowed Scholarship at The College of Wooster.

An active golfer, Pete joined the Wooster Country Club in 1954, where he made two holes-in-one and continued to play regularly until he was 93 years old!

To honor Pete’s legacy and commitment to service, his family established the **Robert “Pete” Bogner Rotary Scholarship Fund**. This scholarship is open to graduating seniors of any high school in Wayne County, Ohio, who are pursuing a degree in a construction-related field of study.



Ryan Nicklaus Miller Memorial Scholarship


A bright young man with a promising future ahead of him, he made friends wherever he went, loved long conversations and good debate. Unfortunately, Ryan Miller passed away unexpectedly at the age of twenty-two, just before he was set to graduate from The Ohio State University.

Ryan graduated with honors, Cum Laude, in 2017 from Wooster High School. During his time in high school, Ryan began to develop two passions—journalism and politics. He was very proud to be a Staff Writer and Editor for *The Wooster Blade* and a member of the Speech and Debate Team. Both fueled his passion and led him to create a network of friends from other schools throughout Ohio – his Speech and Debate Family. Ryan was proud to attend Buckeye Boys State, where he was elected an Associate Supreme Court Justice.

Upon arriving at The Ohio State University, Ryan immediately became involved in many campus organizations that focused on politics making positive change. In Ryan’s own words, “Good policy in the hands of effective legislators is an indispensable tool for improving life for every American.”

Ryan spent two summers in Washington, D.C. as a Congressional Intern for U.S. Representatives Bob Gibbs and Anthony Gonzalez. He loved giving tours to constituents and was tasked with researching and appraising many legislative proposals. He crafted his own policy proposal regarding cybersecurity for Representative Gonzalez.

The ***Ryan Nicklaus Miller Memorial Scholarship Fund*** has been established in his memory for Wayne County graduating seniors who plan to attend The Ohio State University, majoring in Political Science.



Ohio's Hospice LifeCare Launches \$2.5 Million Campaign *Creates center for supportive care*



Since 1982, LifeCare Hospice has been taking care of our neighbors in Wayne County and the surrounding areas. As the population of Ohioans over the age of 65 continues to expand, the organization remains committed to meeting the needs of our community by supporting patients and families, providing access to superior care and service.

To aid them in this mission, Ohio's Hospice LifeCare has launched a \$2.5 million campaign to create dedicated space to meet the needs of those in the community who are facing the end of life. The organization partnered with Wayne County Community Foundation to create the **Hospice Center for Supportive Care Campaign Fund** to support their fundraising efforts.

This campaign includes dedicated building space for three integral areas: bereavement, volunteers, and transportation.

The expanded space for bereavement support connects with the community's need to cope with loss during normal times and during the COVID-19 pandemic. This space will be used for the "Pathways of Hope" program, educational workshops, counseling, and group support options.

Volunteers, who play a vital role for the organization, benefit from dedicated space to provide training and supportive services.

With the addition of a Mobile Care Unit garage and dedicated ambulance garage facility, Hospice LifeCare can expand its services with patient transportation between home, hospital or nursing facilities, and the hospice inpatient pavilion.

To support these efforts, the Foundation's Board of Trustees has awarded a total of \$100,000 in grants from the **John Kaylor Memorial Fund** and two **Anonymous Community Funds**.



Restoration to Open Kister Mill to the Public

Small water-powered mills once dotted the early American landscape. Few remain operational today, but thanks to the work of Western Reserve Land Conservancy, plans are underway to restore, improve, and open to the public one of the nation's oldest working water-powered mills.


Built in 1816, and listed on the National Register of Historic Places, Kister Mill is one of the few historically significant mills remaining in the United States and an iconic example of Wayne County's oldest industry. Via an 18-foot external wooden waterwheel, the mill operated concurrently as a woolen mill, gristmill, sawmill, cider press, workshop, and planing mill.

In addition to the historic preservation component, the Land Conservancy permanently conserves 15 acres of surrounding natural area which contains a fragile, rare wetland ecosystem. The property boasts a 3-acre Great Lakes alvar community – a unique and globally significant habitat – as well as

mature forests and ponds which serve as important habitats for wildlife and rare plants.

Despite its extraordinary historic and educational value, the Mill has never been open to the public. But thanks to the Land Conservancy and a \$25,000 grant from an **Anonymous Community Fund**, all that is about to change. Once restoration efforts are complete, the Mill will be made available for tourism, academic study, environmental education programs, bus tours, and general tourism activities.

William J. Robertson Nature Preserve

When Rittman Paperboard closed its doors in early 2006, the company left vacant a 300-acre property (mostly wetlands and non-buildable) in the heart of the City of Rittman. City officials have plans to develop over 200 of those acres into a nature preserve for all to enjoy. The William J. Robertson Nature Preserve will provide habitat protection and restoration for the property that includes ponds, wetlands, meadows, and young woods, as well as support for several mammal, reptile, and bird species with severely impacted populations.

The Ohio Public Works Commission approved more than \$2.5 million in grant funds through the Clean Ohio Conservation Fund to establish the nature preserve. The City of Rittman must provide matching funds of \$300,000 – which may be a combination of financial contributions and volunteer “in kind” hours of clearing brush, trimming trees, and building pavilions.

Plans call for the preserve to span across two project areas, divided by Salt Street. The 131-acre northern plot will consist of several

wetland areas, more than a dozen ponds, two miles of rustic walking trails, and 1.3 miles of ADA-accessible trails. The 79.6-acre southern plot will include a covered overlook of a pond, three covered observation decks, 1.6 miles of rustic walking trails, and 2.3 miles of ADA-accessible trails. In addition to walking and hiking trails, the preserve will provide opportunities for bird watching, fishing, kayaking and canoeing.

The new park will border the trailhead of an existing 7-mile multipurpose trail. A link between the existing trail and proposed trails in the nature preserve will create a trail loop that extends more than 20 miles.

WCCF Board of Trustees approved a \$27,500 grant from the **General Fund** and an **Anonymous Community Fund** to build a covered pavilion at the entrance of the Rittman Nature Preserve. The rustic structure will be built to blend in with the natural environment and will serve as a shelter and gathering place for visitors.



Beall-Stibbs Homestead Integral Part of Wooster's History

The oldest surviving residential structure in Wooster is getting some needed improvements. Built by General Reasin Beall, one of Wayne County's earliest distinguished citizens, and his wife Rebecca, the Beall-Stibbs Homestead is the centerpiece of the Wayne County Historical Society's campus.

While serving as brigadier general during the War of 1812, Beall marched his army into Wayne County and set up "Camp Christmas" for about three weeks on the west side of Wooster. That area is known today as Christmas Run Park.


After the war, he returned to New Lisbon, Ohio, where he served in the Thirteenth United States Congress. When the office of register for the Federal Land Office in Wooster became vacant in 1814, Beall was appointed by President James Madison. He held that position until resigning in 1824. He remained in Wooster until his death.

After his passing, his eldest daughter Elizabeth and son-in-law Joseph Stibbs II received the home before passing it on to Reasin Beall Stibbs, the third generation of the Beall family.

During the Civil War years, patriotism and support for the troops ran strong in Wooster. Civilians did their part to contribute to the war effort. Many women of the city banded together to form the Wooster Soldier Aid Society. The Society was led by Emeline Stibbs and the Beall-Stibbs Homestead became the center of military relief efforts. Emeline, and her husband, Reasin Beall Stibbs, had four sons fighting in the Civil War.

The home changed hands a few more times before being donated to The College of Wooster in 1924, which used it as a dormitory for female students. In 1954 the College leased the property to the Historical Society in perpetuity for \$1.

The Beall-Stibbs Homestead has undergone several renovations to transition it to an authentic recreation of how it looked during the 19th century. Recently, routine maintenance on the home discovered that significant portions of the foundation have begun to decay – threatening the stability and architectural components of the historic home. WCCF Trustees approved a total of \$25,000 in grants from the **Margaret Hauenstein Memorial Fund, Ceylon E. Hudson Charitable Fund, Edward, Arlene and Kaye Maibach Community Fund, Marjorie B. Newland Memorial Fund, and Robert L. and Kathleen M. Polsky Foundation Community Fund** to make the necessary repairs. The impact of this preservation work will help retain the essential character and authenticity of the building and commemorate life in Wayne County during the 19th century.



LIST OF FUNDS

The Freedlander name is synonymous with community. Harold and Lois Freedlander married in 1939 and moved to Wooster shortly after, working for and eventually taking over the reins of the family business – Freedlander's Department Store. The couple supported many projects throughout Wayne County, but healthcare was a priority. To help achieve their philanthropic goals, Lois established the **Harold and Lois R. Freedlander Community Healthcare Fund**, a permanent endowment to benefit the healthcare needs of low-income residents of Wayne County, Ohio. Lois passed away this year at the age of 104, but the Freedlander Fund will continue to help Wayne County residents in perpetuity.

The Wayne County Children's Advocacy Center, Inc. (WCCAC) is a child-oriented facility which serves as a centralized location for interviewing and examining children who are victims of sexual abuse and severe physical abuse. Cases are managed by a multidisciplinary task force comprised of those interviewers, County children services caseworkers, County prosecutors, law enforcement officers, mental health workers, victim advocates, medical professionals and clinical staff. Members of the task force team help the child and family cope with the abuse and begin the recovery process. To aid them in this important work, WCCAC established the ***Children's Advocacy Fund*** at the Foundation.






Throughout the pandemic, **Wooster Hope Center (WHC)** has kept the citizens of Wayne County fed. Through innovation and local outreach, the Hope Center is currently assisting over 1,000 families each month. For every \$10 received in donations, the organization was able to purchase 250 pounds of food – providing 208 meals. This year, 2021, marks their 10th anniversary—and the organization intends to celebrate by expanding their services. WHC plans to open satellite pantries in Shreve, Apple Creek, Orrville, Rittman, and Creston in addition to starting a mobile food pantry.


The Foundation makes grants only to organizations recognized by the Internal Revenue Code as nonprofit, tax-exempt, charitable organizations, including schools and churches; or to qualified governmental agencies. The Foundation does not make grants to individuals. All scholarship checks go directly to the schools where students are enrolled.

Unrestricted donations to the Foundation are added to the General Fund. Along with other Community Funds, these gifts allow the Board of Trustees to respond to innovative projects and the changing needs of the community. Charitable organizations serving the residents of Wayne County, Ohio are invited to apply for grants through our competitive grants process.

Application deadlines are March 1 and September 1 each year. The Women’s Fund accepts grants applications once a year, with a deadline on September 1. The deadline for GIVE 365 grant applications is March 1. Nonprofit organizations serving Wayne County youth may also apply to the Youth Foundation by February 1 each year. The award deadline for the Wayne County Children’s Resource Fund is September 1. To complete a grant proposal application, please visit **WayneCountyCommunityFoundation.org**.

David Broehl 1947-2020

The passing of David Broehl in October 2020 was a great loss to our community. David touched many lives with his compassion for others, commitment to community, and personal generosity.

David came to Wooster by way of The College of Wooster in 1965, where he made treasured life-long friendships and met his wife, Margo. Described as a “professional good guy”, he spent his entire career in social services advocating on behalf of marginalized communities – abused and at-risk youth, the developmentally disabled, the elderly, the homeless – all for the betterment of the broader Wooster community.

David was a tireless volunteer, serving on various nonprofit boards throughout his life. His greatest love became the Wayne County Historical Society, where he devoted much time, energy, and enthusiasm. He loved to work in groups to achieve consensus. At the time of his passing, David was championing projects including the Charles Follis Trail, work on behalf of the NAACP, and the Medway Levy Committee. His goal was always to help others succeed and to make his corner of the world a better place.

David lived a life of gratitude, committed to serving others. He will be remembered for his kind heart and his unflinching service to our community.


FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

The Wayne County Community Foundation is committed to growing the philanthropic resources of our community through careful stewardship of the Foundation's assets. Effective financial management allows the Foundation to respond to today's needs while preserving and enhancing the real value of the funds for future needs.

Our investment strategy aims to preserve and enhance the value of donor gifts, build capital for the future, and meet community needs today. To accomplish these objectives, we maintain a diversified portfolio overseen by multiple managers.

Asset Growth

Asset growth is achieved through receiving new gifts and bequests, earning positive net returns on our investments, and ensuring that grant awards do not exceed available resources. In the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021, the Foundation's total assets increased to \$126.2 million. This includes the addition of more than \$15 million in new gifts for the Foundation, including over \$6 million in permanent assets, during the 2020-2021 fiscal year.



Investment Returns

Overall, the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021 produced an investment gain of 24.4%. The return rate is net of all investment and banking fees, except for WCCF's administrative fee (ranging from 0.5% to 1.0%, depending on type and/or size of the Fund). Below are the Foundation's net investment returns over one, three, five, and ten year periods.

The Foundation's Investment Committee is comprised of individuals with financial experience who establish policy, hire investment managers, and evaluate performance. In turn, the Investment Committee is advised by independent investment consultants, Clearstead Advisors, LLC of Cleveland, with regard to all aspects of the Foundation's investment portfolio. The Foundation uses The Commercial & Savings Bank for banking services and Fidelity Investments for custody services.


